

# World-beater wine can be yours for £5

A SPARKLING wine costing just £4.99 a bottle has been named one of the best in the world.

Griffith Park Rosé (pictured) was listed in the planet's top ten fizzy wines, beating hundreds of others from 24 countries.

The Australian drop, which is sold by supermarket chain Morrison's, was the only non-French wine to make it into the ten at the Effervescents Du Monde competition in Dijon, France.

The remainder in the list were champagnes.

Islay Kennedy of Vickery Wines, which imports and supplies Griffith Park Rosé, said: 'It is wonderful to receive such an accolade.'

'We are very proud of Griffith Park and think it is an excellent wine.'

'It is great to hear that experts think the same.'

He added: 'It used to be Mateus Rosé for everyday drinking and pink fizz for Valentine's Day and Mothering Sunday.'

A total of 34 gold medals and 102 silver medals were handed out at the two-day wine contest. Half of the winners hailed from France.
